## Chinchilla Care Sheet

## Habitat Setup: ٠

- Use a cage that's big enough for your Chinchilla to jump and play. Ο
- Line the bottom with bedding made of paper or aspen shavings. 0
- Provide platforms and shelves for climbing and resting. 0
- Include a hiding house where your Chinchilla can feel safe. 0
- **Temperature and Environment:** 
  - Keep the cage in a cool, dry place away from direct sunlight and drafts. 0
  - Chinchillas prefer temperatures between 60-70°F (15-21°C). 0
  - Avoid placing the cage near heaters or air conditioners. 0
- Feeding:
  - Offer fresh hay like timothy hay or orchard grass every day. 0
  - Provide Chinchilla pellets as their main food source, about 1-2 tablespoons per day. 0

  - Watch for signs of illness like loss of appetite, discharge from eyes or nose, or changes in behavior. 0
  - Take your Chinchilla to a veterinarian who knows about Chinchillas if you notice any health concerns. 0
  - Brush your Chinchilla gently with a soft-bristled brush to keep its fur clean and free of mats. 0

  - Chinchillas have the softest fur of any mammal and love to take dust baths to keep their fur clean. 0
  - They can jump up to 6 feet in the air! 0
  - Chinchillas are nocturnal, which means they are most active during the night. 0
