PacMan Frog Care Sheet

Habitat Setup:

- Use a terrarium or tank that's at least 10 gallons in size. 20 Gallon is preferred.
- Cover the bottom with 1-2 inches of damp soil or coconut fiber bedding.
- Add a shallow water dish that's big enough for your frog to sit in comfortably.
- Place a hiding spot like a small cave or half-log where your frog can hide.
- Temperature and Lighting:
 - Keep the tank between 75-85°F during the day.
 - At night, the temperature can be a little cooler, around 65-75°F.
 - PacMan frogs don't need special lights, but if your room is dark, you can use a low-wattage heat lamp.
- Feeding:
 - Feed your PacMan frog live insects like crickets, mealworms, or small roaches. Larger PacMan frogs will eat pinky mice.
 - $_{\odot}$ Offer insects about the size of your frogs head, 2-3 times a week.
 - Dust insects with calcium and vitamin supplements once a week.
- Handling:
 - Wash your hands before and after handling your frog to keep it safe from germs.
 - Hold your frog gently and close to the ground, as they can jump.
 - Limit handling to a few minutes at a time, a couple of times a week.
- Cleaning:
 - Spot clean the tank every day by removing uneaten food and poop.
 - Change the water in the dish every day.
 - Replace all the bedding and clean the tank thoroughly every 3-4 weeks.
- Health and Behavior:
 - PacMan frogs are usually quiet and like to hide during the day.
 - If your frog looks swollen or stops eating, it might be sick; ask an adult for help.
 - Regularly check for any signs of illness like unusual spots, discharge, or lack of movement.
- Fun Facts:
 - PacMan frogs are called that because their round shape and big mouths look like the video game character Pac-Man.
 - They come in different colors like green, brown, and even albino!
